## **Lesson Plan: Interactive Phonics Learning Webpage**

# **Objective:**

By the end of the lesson, children will be able to:

- 1. Identify and recognize the sounds of the letters A, B, and C.
- 2. Associate letter sounds with corresponding words or objects.
- 3. Engage in interactive phonics activities to reinforce learning.

### Materials Needed:

- 1. Access to a computer or tablet with internet connection.
- 2. Interactive phonics learning webpage or app (e.g., Jolleyphonics).

### Lesson Plan:
