Third Day Lesson Plan: Exploring More Phonics Fun

Objective: By the end of the lesson, children will be able to:

- 1. Review previously learned letters and sounds (A-F).
- 2. Introduce new letters G, H, and I, along with their corresponding sounds.
- 3. Engage in a variety of interactive activities to reinforce phonics skills.

Materials Needed:

- 1. Access to the same computer or tablet with internet connection used in previous lessons.
- 2. Interactive phonics learning webpage or app.
- 3. Alphabet flashcards or letter magnets.
- 4. Whiteboard or large paper with markers.
- 5. Printable worksheets or coloring pages related to the letters G, H, and I.

Lesson Plan:

Introduction (5 minutes):
